Park entrances

Just a friendly reminder that as we go to enjoy the park, to be respectful of the yards for homeowners that live along the easement. Please use the sidewalks and walkways while enjoying our park.

Street Trees

Thank you to homeowners who trimmed their street trees this summer! There is still work to be done however. Please check the branches on your street trees and trim any that are not in accordance with City of East Lansing Ordinance Sec. 48-62. Trimming:

... any tree shall be kept so trimmed that there shall be a clear height of not less than 12 feet above the portion of the surface of the [street] used for vehicular traffic, and not less than seven feet above all sidewalks, unobstructed by branches; and no such person shall fail to remove all dead branches or stubs on such tree or trees which are, or may become, a menace to travelers on a street. (Code 1994, ch. 36, § 3.15)

Please trim your tree branches ASAP

It was a great year with the New Hawk Nest Park being used extensively throughout the summer. It's great to have so many families enjoying the park!

Storm Drain cleaning

A part of your annual dues go to maintaining the storm drains. Over the next several weeks, we will have Michigan Plumbing come in to clean and inspect the storm drain system in Phases 1 and 2 (Phase 3 responsibilities have for storm drains have not yet been turned over to the HNHOA). Once they start the work, we expect the project to take approximately two weeks to complete. You will see their vehicles parked near the main storm drains, and they may even need to access the drain on your property. The storm drain easements are five foot from each side lot line and 10 foot from the lot line at the back of the property (for more information, reference the Master Deed doc # 5015889 an example can be found on page 40 of 50 of this document.) This activity is done approximately every five to seven years.

As a homeowner, you can help keep the drain system clean by making sure that grass, debris, and dirt build up are kept out of the drain area. This keeps grass and sediment from flowing through the storm drains and into the storm detention ponds or the Sanderson drain along the North Tier Trail at the far east side of the neighborhood. Keeping this system cleaned out as much as possible will minimize the costs and frequency for dredging the detention ponds in future years (this would be paid for by funds from annual dues). This may be a little noisy at times. More information will be shared as it becomes available.

Exterior changes to homes

With summer coming to a close, some homeowners are working to complete projects like fences, additions, sheds, pools, decks, etc before the cold weather arrives. We would like to remind the homeowners that before starting these projects make sure you get the approval of the architectural committee.

Speed
